We are a small Newcastle based charity. We have been supporting our 3 programmes of work in Koboko, a remote and less developed part of Uganda for 10 years.

All of the funds we raise go directly to the local leaders of each programme.

Antunetas Orphanage

In Antunetas Orphanage we have been sponsoring the education and care of 10 orphan children.

We began when they were starting primary school. The same children have grown and will soon be leaving school. Our challenge for them will be to support them to learn skills to earn their living.

We support the orphanage in teaching practical skills to the children such as farming, poultry and goat keeping, sewing and dress making.





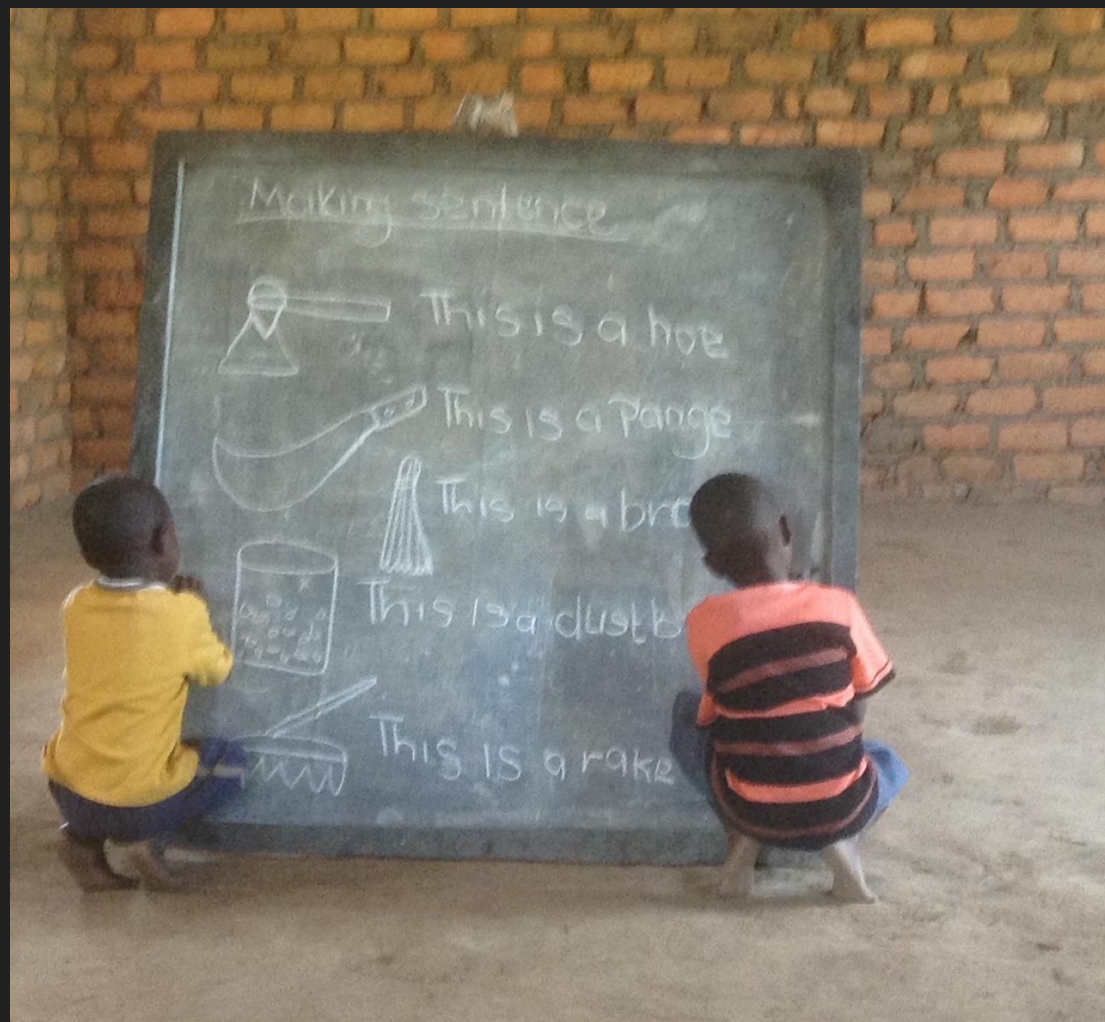




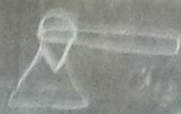
Mereba School & Community

Mereba School project began in a community where there was no school. Volunteers from a local church would sometime come to teach basic lessons in the shade of a mango tree.

With support from UCT and some church groups the community built a school. UCT pays the salary of the teachers. Over 100 children have begun their schooling in this school. It is well supported by the community.
